1999 Head of the Cuyahoga sets a new course.



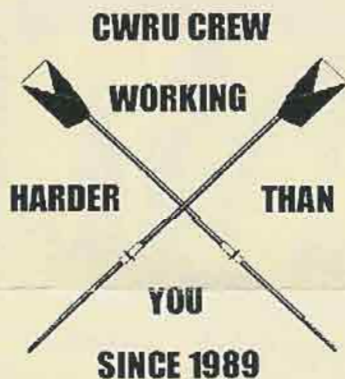
On October 18, 1999, the Head of the Cuyahoga took place here in Cleveland, over 5000m of twisting turning river. The challenges of steering the course were slightly altered this year, because the racecourse has moved approximately 2000m

downstream! The finish line was located in the famous Flats district, and was visible to the spectators lining both sides of the river.

Case Crew competed in three events: Men's Open 4+, Women's Open 8, and Women's Open 4+. All of the crews fared well, the Men's 4+ earned medals (bronze), and the women's boats had hard fought fourth place finishes, beating out Beaumont (WO 4+) and Clearfork (WO 8).
